I did not see Miss Lape, but was told on arriving that a substitute had been rejected. A local difference was responsible for this, which mattered little, for the colored people here are almost solid for Hughes.

Was the impression correct that you contemplated work as organizer of the N. A. A. C. P. ? I am hoping so, I would like to do something to aid the best little organizer there is.
