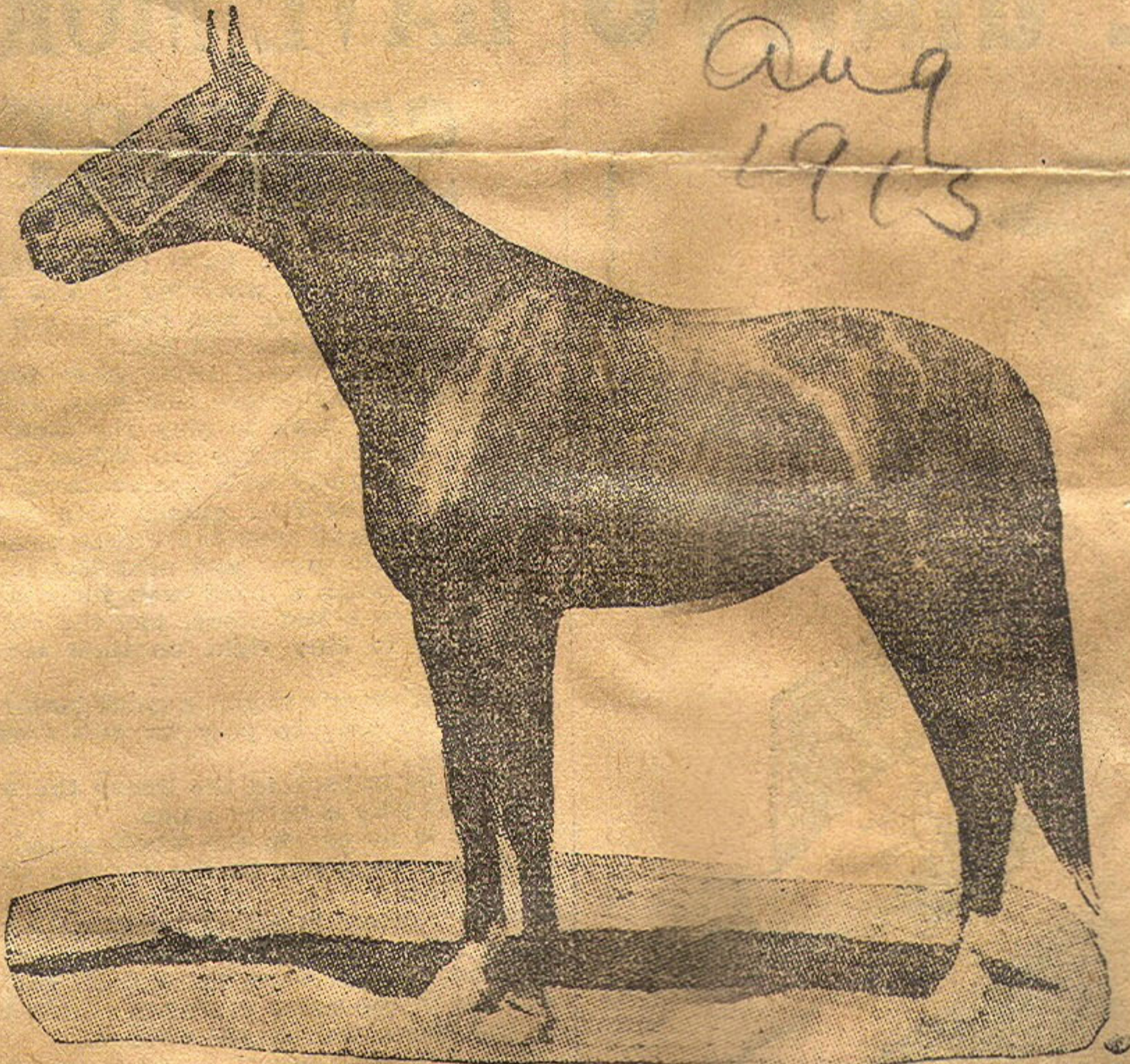


Asquith and Ragtime Suffragettes Due in Boston Next Week

The Suffragettes Horse Who Will Bring "Votes for Women" Ragtime from New York to Boston.

NEW YORK, Aug. 4.—Asquith is going to Boston in behalf of the "votes for women" case.
