Suffragists on to Capital

Pilgrims Have a Preliminary Taste of Weather in Ride Down Fifth Avenue.

Suffrage pilgrims who will leave to-morrow on their hike to Washington, carrying suffrage greetings to President-elect Wilson, yesterday experienced a sample of the weather which the weather prophets predict will follow them a considerable part of the three weeks' tramp.

Their ears were nipped by the frosty breezes, and after the expedition down Fifth avenue on top of a bus, and standing around two hours making speeches at Union and Madison squares and later in Park Row, the pilgrims bought extra sweaters, caps and red mittens to add to their hiking kits.

Boldt circulated among the crowd handing out suffrage dodgers, while Mrs. James Lees Laidlaw, Helena Hay Greeley and Colonel Ida Craft began talking from the top of the bus.

An impertinent young woman began to heckle the pilgrims, and as the crowd pressed in around the two women, threatening a riot, the police took a hand. They ordered the troublesome young woman "to go on home."

From the National headquarters, at Fifth avenue and Forty-second street, down Fifth avenue the Pilgrims were cheered, men waving their hats and women their handkerchiefs. Rose Sanderson acted as bugler, and the sound collected great crowds, wher-

Second Crusade Starts This Morning at 9 o'clock from Hudson Terminal Building.

Promptly at 9 o'clock this morning the Second Suffrage Crusade will start on its way to the conquest of Columbia (District of), and all by stations. No matter what low down tricks the fickle weather man may have stooped to since he parted from the suffragists last night, crossing his heart he believed in votes for women and would send them fair weather; no matter how the Jersey populace jeers, or the tender feet ache in the red mud, it's on to Washington for "General" Rosalie Jones and "Colonel" Ida Craft, and all the sturdy recruits.

And, by the way, the hoodoo, which wasn't a hoodoo, is lifted. Three new recruits enlisted yesterday, thus spoiling the total of thirteen, which was the official enrolment on Saturday. The newest suffragettes are Miss Celia Gaffney, a sister of Judge Gaffney; Miss Minerva Crowell, a product of newspaper enthusiasm for the trip, and Miss Flora Cornelia Allyn, of Mystic, Conn. Miss Allyn is the only member of the mysterious, promised five from Connecticut to materialize—so far.

The army will be "mustered in" at the Hudson Terminal Building, inside, at 9 o'clock. And, alas! that there is no footpath over the Hudson!—will go by train to Newark. The real march begins there about 9:40 o'clock. Local suffragists, headed by Mrs. Clara V. Laddey, Mrs. Elizabeth Oppenheimer, Mrs. Beatrice Henry and Miss Emma Bowne will escort the army to Elizabeth, where they will be entertained at the Elks Club. Then on to Metuchen for the night. To-morrow the army will reach Princeton, where attempts to convert the college boys will be made.
