My dear Miss Freeman:

In accordance with our conversation of this afternoon, I wish to make the following offer:

If you will furnish me with a biographical sketch of yourself, and press notices or personal commendation, and will place your interests in my hands until the end of the present season, say until May 15th, giving me the booking of all lectures which you may deliver outside of Greater New York during that period, I will prepare and send out a four-page circular somewhat similar to those enclosed, on the following conditions:

I am responsible for the cost of the printed matter, but the same shall be deducted from any fees you may receive before any division is made between us. You will pay the railroad fares, but they will be deducted before any division is made between us. From the net fees, after deducting printing and your expenses, you will receive Seventy Five Percent and I Twenty Five Percent.

If you do not care to accept this proposition I will be glad to send out any circular that you may prepare for me, with my name and address on same.

If I arrange for the printing of the circulars it must be understood that you will be available for lectures at least once or twice a week during the winter season, otherwise it will not pay me to go into the matter in that way.

Your acceptance of this offer, sending one copy to me and retaining the duplicate, will constitute a contract between us.
